As you know, we have a number of pupils who are attending school because their parent/ parents are critical key workers. We do ask that if this applies to you that you only send them into school if they are unable to be cared for at home. Thank you to those parents who have already been in touch to say that they can reduce the number of days when their child attends school. We also have families who are attending school for other reasons, such as those with EHCPs and the expectations with these pupils is that they are in as much as possible. We will be in constant communication with you all regarding this.

The local authority and DFE continue to issue guidance as the days roll on. As I said before, if expectations around class sizes and other restrictions change, then we will need to start reviewing the number of school places that we are available to offer to key worker families.

We now have a ranking system for offering places, which I summarise below:

- I. Priority group | NHS workers
- 2. Priority group 2 Wider health and social care, educational professionals and security
- 3. **Priority group 3 other groups as identified**
- Key public services, Local and national government. Food and other necessary goods, Transport, Utilities, communication and financial services
