Guided Reading/Phonics

In guided reading, we will be exploring the text 'Flat Stanley' by Jeff brown. We will focus on retrieving information from the text and making simple inferences about what we have read.

Your child will choose a text to take home and read every week.

RWI Phonics will take place every day. Your child will be given a phonics book to read at home every week.

English

Our key text in English this term is 'The Tiger who Came to Tea' by Judith Kerr.

During the first few weeks of term, we will be writing a recount in the form of a diary based on our text. Then, we will write a story about a different character who came to tea.


Later on, we will be finding out facts about Tigers so that we can write a fact-file about all about them!
